It's official. The Cowichan Housing Association is now incorporated! Congratulations and thank you to everyone who worked hard over the years to contribute to establishing this community service organization!

1. **Cowichan Housing Association:** We are delighted to announce that as of January 14, 2015, the new housing association is incorporated! This move comes out of direction given in our community consultation process of 2012. This development comes with the blessing of Social Planning Cowichan. The Cowichan Housing Association (CHA) has a 6 month MOU with SPC as we complete the transition process.

The new board is presently comprised of: Brigid Reynolds (long-time co-chair of RAHD and senior planner with North Cowichan), Chris Hall (co-chair of RAHD, member SPC board and private consultant); Tina Schoen (previous steering committee member and representative of Cowichan Women Against Violence); Monica Finn (previous steering committee member, Awareness and Advocacy committee member, Vancouver Island Regional Library); and Debbie Williams (Hiye'yu Lelum – House of Friendship).

The Regional Affordable Housing Directorate (RAHD) will also transition with CHA. RAHD will continue to meet as in the past and function as an open community consultation forum to keep concerned stakeholders informed of our activities and to invite feedback and further engagement.

2. **February 10 - Next meeting of RAHD:** Please mark Tuesday, February 10th on your calendars as the date for the next meeting of RAHD. Time: 4:45 to 7:00 pm. Koksilah Room, Island Savings Centre, 2687 James St. The agenda will be sent out late next week. This will be an opportunity to tell you more about CHA and update you on our on-going work.
3. **What have we been up to since our last RAHD meeting?** Lots! The Housing Trust Fund business case is progressing. Homelessness Action Week was a big success again this year. Through the Homelessness Partnering Strategy Grant we hired two housing support workers (to the end of March) - they have been busy assisting clients. We are also offering housing support in Chemainus at the Cowichan Neighbourhood House. We hosted 3 Ready to Rent classes in the fall and 4 more will run over the winter. The Rental Assistance program is always well used. We have hosted 3 tenant's rights workshops and have more planned. We hosted a landlords' breakfast in January. We will be offering a workshop on lowering your energy use – and thus your bill. Plus lots more. Join us at the RAHD meeting to hear more.

Love, Fear, and Shame in Education



A thought-provoking discussion about revolutionary approaches to education that enhance learning and self-motivation, while dramatically reducing violence in schools.

This inspirational lecture, based on Robin Grille's book of the same title, will provide a fascinating look at parenting customs that have shaped societies and major world events, revealing how children adapt to parenting styles and how these experiences underpin the adults they become and, ultimately, the way the world is structured.

Robin Grille draws upon revolutionary new research to argue that safeguarding children's emotional development is the key to creating a more peaceful and harmonious world.

Robin emphasizes that our future rests on the way we care for parents, and the way we treat children. This presentation takes you from past horrors to present hope. You will learn how recent fundamental changes in child-rearing approaches have shifted human consciousness, giving birth to modern movements for human rights, justice, democracy, equality and sustainability. You will also learn how these universal issues impact on the way that we work with young children and their families.

Certainly, there is much more work to do. But what would the future hold for humanity if these positive reforms in child-rearing continue to grow? What is your personal role in this unfolding global movement?

This session will include a closing address from **Dr. Richard Stanwick**, Chief Medical Health Officer, Island Health.

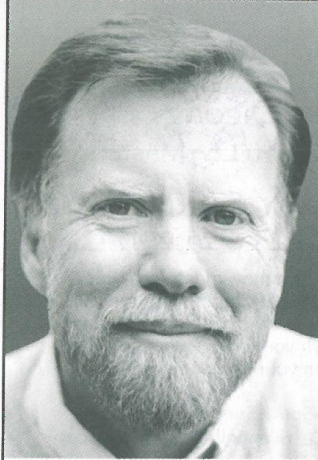
Self-Regulation Is Now The Predictor of Social and Academic Success



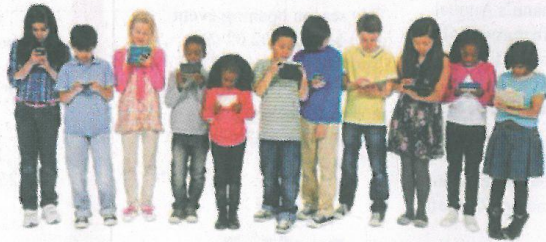
